Why Hire An Investigator?

- Expertise
- Interviewing Skills
- Court Skills
- Danger Factor
- Legal Issues



Why Hire An Investigator?

- Technology
- The Law
- Recognition
- Evidence Gathering
- Amount of Time Required



The Contract

- Be Specific
- What Is The Job?
- Educate Your Client
- Get all details before accepting case
- Who is the client's attorney?
- Has another Investigator been used?



The Contract

- Explain Costs
- Is there a conflict?
- Get a proper Retainer
- You need enough time (retainer) to have better chance of success



Child Custody

What can an Investigator do?

- Protect child from danger or abuse
- Report on living environment
- Report on improper conduct
- Look for signs of alcohol and/or drug abuse



Child Custody

What can an Investigator do?

- Document amount of time spent with the child
- Document any reckless behavior
- Check Criminal Records
- Check Civil records



Child Custody

What can an Investigator do?

- Interview Witnesses
- Provide peace of mind
- Help provide documentation of compliance by the Client



Child Custody Tips for your Client

- Have Child's best interest at heart
- Keep a Journal (including their compliance)
- DO NOT attempt to adversely affect the Child's relationship with other parent or guardian

Child Custody Tips for your Client

- DO NOT degrade other parent or connected persons in front of the Child
- Do not violate terms of temporary custody or visitations
- Do not expose the child to un-safe conditions

Child Custody Tips for your Client

- Do not be involved in another improper relationship
- Spend time with your children
- Keep all appointed meetings and schedules
- Do not discuss or involve child with divorce details
- Want custody for the right reasons

What can Investigators do?

- Document improper marital conduct
- Document drug or alcohol abuse
- Document criminal activity
- Document spousal abuse
- Interview Witnesses
- Testify in court



Signs of a cheating spouse

- Change in hygiene
- Change in appearance
- Change in the relationship
- Noticeable increase or lack of affection
- Withdrawn, avoid eye contact when first arriving home

Signs of a cheating spouse

- Texting or on cell phone more than usual
- Spending increased time away from home, with friends or co-workers
- Bills, especially cellular are no longer arriving to home or business address
- Unusual amount of time on the computer and internet

Signs of a cheating spouse

- Has stopped receiving email at home, may indicate a new email address
- Suddenly purchased a new cell phone, or pre-paid cellular
- Texts and calls are regularly being deleted from cell phone

Surveillance

Three steps for better surveillance

- Planning
 - What is purpose of surveillance?
 - Gather all information
 - Check equipment
 - Disguises and pre-texts
 - Surveillance Schedules

Basics for all surveillance

- **✓** Record the times and make entries often
- ✓ Maintain a Log system
 - 1. Notebook and pencil
 - 2. Tape recorder
- ✓ Record all activity. May be important later.
- ✓ Do not park your car facing the object of your surveillance
- ✓ Do not smoke or attempt not to smoke
- **✓** Do not leave engine running



Following Cars

- The hardest and most dangerous activities as a P.I.
- Never follow too closely: do not tail gate
- Use a buffer vehicle between you
- Your car should not be a Hummer or a red sports car
- You can not break the traffic laws
- When using two follow vehicles, switch out the lead vehicles
- On multi-lane road, drive in an opposite lane
- For night time surveillance: study the tail light formation



Watching a Person at a House

- o Look for all signs of activities
- o Listen for sounds
- o Make sure they are at home
- o Look for changing light patterns



- o Your license does not give you the permission to trespass
- o Today's society is concerned with security
- o Use your props and gimmicks



Watching a person in a public place

- Once again, beware of public awareness
- Certain places might be offensive to video or photograph
- Use covert camera equipment but camcorders are accepted part of society
- Try to blend do not act suspicious
- Avoid parking in dark alleys or away from other cars
- Have your pretext ready
- Do you notify police or security?
- Don't forget to continue to log your activities

Documenting The Case

- Keep detailed log
- Video and Photos
- Document improper conduct
- Identify all relationships
- Record and log all persons of interest
- Record and log all suspicious vehicles
- Get tag numbers
